Attendance

Evaluations

- ▶ 40 % final exam (individual oral – press article dealing with a theme studied in the year – summary + opinion)
- ▶ 60 % continuous assessment : 4 vocabulary tests, 2 oral presentations, 1 listening exercise, 1 reading/writing exercise
- ▶ Catch-up session: continuous assessment (25%), written exam (25%, listening+ reading + opinion essay), oral exam (50% = same 1st session) July

Oral presentations: 2 per student

- ▶ Individual: Research paper (presentation of a clinical trial)
- ▶ In pairs: Health news (presentation of a press article: summary + opinion)
