Presentations

You will make a short presentation on one of the following topics:

- **1. Describing trends**: choose an **interesting line graph in English** and describe it, using the vocabulary in the handout. **Do not choose** a multiple line graph. The graph should show **two line graphs maximum**. You can suggest reasons for the trends you have described. (3-4 minutes)
- **2. Applying for a job**: in pairs, roleplay a job interview. You <u>must use</u> at least 10 questions and answers from the handout p.9. You can add other questions which you deem relevant. (6 to 8 minutes)
- **3. Telephoning**: in pairs, roleplay a business phone call. You <u>must use</u> the language and skills learnt in class. Choose / Invent a situation or ask the teacher for guidelines. (3-4 minutes)
- **4.** You can also make a short **summary** of a **recent newspaper or magazine** (paper or online) **article** dealing with current affairs in the English-speaking countries below. Mention the paratext (source, author, publishing date, title), the topic, and structure your summary. Explain why you have chosen this article and if it deals with a controversial issue, give your opinion. (4-5 minutes)

You should check the Internet for guidelines on how to make such a summary.

5. English-speaking countries: New Zealand, Australia, South Africa, Ireland, Canada. Locate the country, mention the main historical facts (select them carefully), its political system (do not go into details), official languages and develop one or two **lesser-known** cultural aspects. (4-5 minutes)

You must not read from notes: this is an oral exercise.
